

Collegiate Branch Initiative - Establishing a Baseline GCA John Stipp


Earlier this year, we introduced the Collegiate Branch Initiative (a.k.a. the CDE Program). Details of this were emailed to each Chapter and an excellent overview was presented in the October issue of the *Chrome and Blue*.

For any program to be successful, it needs to have measurable outcomes. It is difficult to know where you are going if you do not know where you currently are. For the expectations that are proposed, we should have that capability. The metrics that we can use to measure our outcomes should be readily available to us, and historical data should also be easy to compile. To date, I have compiled data for the Fall Semester 2006 Rush numbers that are available, which should give us an idea as to how diversified we are in our rush activities.

Looking over the following pie chart, it appears that we are doing fairly well in our diversity by majors. Although the number of pledges that are not Chemistry or Chemical Engineering majors is heavily dominated by Biochemistry and Biology majors, there are a substantial number of other related majors that our Chapters are pledging. I was very pleased to see this trend, and from this data it can be concluded that many of our Chapters are doing well at recruiting in several chemistry-related majors. By excelling in this area, you can help your Chapter be well positioned as the fields of science become more integrated, and also provide the Alpha Chi Sigma experience to a broader group of future Brothers.



The next pie chart shows the distribution of our pledges by class. The vast majority of our pledges are undergraduates, followed by graduate students. Only one faculty member was pledged this semester. I would suspect that this has been the case for some time, and is not an off semester for faculty pledges. Based upon this, we should try to pay particular attention to recruiting across undergraduate, graduate, and faculty groups. This is not an easy task, and it is my hope that the Grand Chapter can provide some sort of targeted rush materials to help our Chapters recruit from these other groups.



With that said, I believe that we now have a baseline for where we are in our efforts towards diversity in our Collegiate Chapter membership. We can use this data to see where we may want to put some additional effort in the semesters ahead.

I will do my best to provide feedback on how we progress with the Collegiate Branch Initiative as well as continuing to provide tools for you to help meet these goals. With the proper tools, I believe that all of our Chapters can be successful.
