A Dedicated Member of Alpha Chi Sigma

Alpha Chi Sigma lost one of its most devoted members. Paul R. Jones, 68, died August 16 in Denton, TX. Brother Jones initiated into Beta Eta Chapter in 1970.

He served Alpha Chi Sigma in numerous roles, giving much of his time in service to Alpha Chi Sigma. Paul served as advisor to Beta Eta Chapter during 1970-71, 1985-86 and in 1989.

He was elected as Grand Professional Alchemist and served from 1986-88 then as Grand Collegiate Alchemist from 1988-90. He became Grand Master Alchemist in 1990-92 at which time he began his role as Grand Recorder in 1992, a role he continued until 2004. He also served the Fraternity as Grand Parliamentarian since 1992 and as Secretary-Treasurer of the Educational Foundation. In 2006, he was awarded the John R. Kuebler Award; the highest award Alpha Chi Sigma can bestow



on one of its members and is presented for outstanding service to the Fraternity and outstanding service to the profession or accomplishment in the science of chemistry.

Brother Jones was a faculty member in the University of North Texas Department of Chemistry from 1968-2006. He attended Pennsylvania State University and Purdue University where he earned a doctorate in chemistry in 1966.

Paul's dedication and counsel to the Fraternity and Educational Foundation will be greatly missed.

Risk Management

Make sure that you have MSDS sheets on hand any time chemicals are to be used (chemistry magic shows, etc.) and that you have fire extinguishers present at an event where there are to be any candles. Even at events where there are not candles or chemicals, please keep the safety of your Brothers in mind and do not expose anyone to any risks to their physical safety. The safety of our Brothers, pledges, and those around us should be our highest priority.

We should give and expect no less.

Supreme Council News

The Supreme Council had a busy summer. Much of its effort was focused on choosing a location for the 50th Biennial Conclave, composing a Fraternity Policy Manual, and hosting the District Counselors for a meeting. During the SC-DC meeting a variety of topics were discussed including district conclaves, risk management, interacting with chapters and faculty, developing an effective district committee, and effective chapter communication. It provided a great opportunity for all involved to bond, share ideas, and get motivated for the coming year.

The following propositions were passed this summer.

Proposition 4227 Members of the Supreme Council, the Grand Recorder, the Assistant Grand Recorder, and the National Office Manager shall annually submit and sign a Conflict of Interest statement to the Grand Recorder for review by the Supreme Council. In situations where there is an established conflict of interest, the person involved may not take part in the final deliberations of a contract or resolution and may not vote on the issue.

Proposition 4228 The attached file retention policy be adopted to provide for the systematic review, retention and destruction of documents received or created by Alpha Chi Sigma Fraternity in connection with the transaction of organization business.

Proposition 4229 That the authorization of Mu Chapter to elect and initiate properly qualified students from the University of Rhode Island in Kingston, RI granted by SC Proposition 4155 be extended to expire on June 30, 2010.

Proposition 4230 That the Supreme Council accepts the bid from Gamma Nu Chapter. The 50th Biennial Conclave will be held on the Ohio University Campus in Athens, Ohio from August 3 to August 8, 2010.

Proposition 4231 The National Alpha Chi Sigma web site will remain non-commercial. Any exceptions to this policy that would allow a link to a commercial site must be approved by a Supreme Council proposition. This policy shall also apply to the web sites of subordinate chapters. This proposition replaces SC Proposition 3678.

Proposition 4232 In order to provide better service to our members who desire Fraternity jewelry, a link to the Alpha Chi Sigma page on the Herff-Jones website is permitted on Alpha Chi Sigma web sites.

Proposition 4233 Supreme Council responsibilities will be assigned within 30 days of the appointment of a new council.

Proposition 4234 That Ian Taft, Nu 2007 be expelled from the Fraternity pursuant to a valid petition received from Nu chapter.

Proposition 4235 The Supreme Council will meet in Indianapolis in January, 2010, at Grand Chapter expense to conduct Grand Chapter business.

Proposition 4236 Due to the excellent service and the willingness to provide a special price on a kit of chemicals needed to conduct a tie dye outreach program, a link to the Colorado Wholesale Dye Company is permitted on Alpha Chi Sigma web sites.

Proposition 4237 That the attached investment policy be adopted to direct the prudent investment of the Alpha Chi Sigma Fraternity portfolio in a matter consistent with the objectives stated therein.

Proposition 4238 That the Supreme Council approves and adopts the policy manual dated 31 July 2009.

Proposition 4239 The Chesapeake Bay Professional Chapter be declared inactive.

The Science Outreach Program

To encourage and recognize participation in science outreach programs, the Fraternity established the Wyvern Pin Program. Science outreach being broadly defined as any activity that promotes the second object among pre-college age groups. There are four levels that can be earned in a member's lifetime. Each level has a corresponding colored Wyvern pin.









Level One - Black - One activity completed.

Level Two – Green – Three activities completed.

Level Three – Red – Seven activities within a 24 month period. At least one of these activities must involve scouting (Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Explorers, Cub Scouts, etc.). One activity may be aimed at a general audience rather than a pre-college audience.

Level Four – Blue – Fifteen activities within a 36 month period. At least two must involve scouting. Two activities may be aimed at a general audience rather than a pre-college audience. A Brother must submit a brief (2-3 paragraph minimum) article to The HEXAGON. The article should describe an activity and include a photograph showing the interaction between the applicant and the audience.
