Annual Report of the Grand Master Alchemist December 31, 2012

Overview

The year of 2012 was a productive one for the Fraternity. We installed three new collegiate chapters and added a professional chapter and a professional group to our ranks. We also have several pre-colonies in the works and we expect some more collegiate colonies coming soon.

<u>Goals</u>

There is one major goal for my term as GMA; that is growth. You have already seen this in the annual solicitation sent out this past fall. We want to improve our expansion efforts and discover new ways to create more collegiate chapters, more professional chapters, and more professional groups. Along the way we need to grow our financial resources. We need to develop and improve new fund raising efforts as well as generate efficiencies in operations to save costs. As we grow we will have more people and resources to offer more benefits to our members. You have already seen some of these benefits in the recent past. Some of them include reduced insurance rates from Gieco, new alcohol awareness training for all collegiate chapters and colonies, reduced rates at Gradspring for technical job opportunities, and a new and improved Wyvern Pin outreach policy.

Conclave

Alpha Theta at the University of Iowa hosted an excellent 51st Biennial Conclave. Several motions came out of this event requiring actions by the SC or office.

Motion 15: Be it resolved that the Grand Chapter directs the Supreme Council to form a committee to evaluate the ratio of collegiate to professional representation in the Grand Chapter paying particular attention to the expectation of expansion in the professional branch. The committee should include a Professional Representative, a District Counselor, a professional chapter member and a collegiate chapter member. The committee should report back to the Grand Chapter before the 52nd Biennial Conclave. The report should also be presented to the Grand Chapter at the first Grand Chapter session of conclave. Actions: The committee will be formed in the next several months and will most likely be chaired by the GMA.

Motion 21: Be it resolved that Alpha Chi Sigma establish an outreach program to serve as a structured program targeting students at the primary and secondary education levels. The suggested outline of the program is detailed in the attached proposal. A committee shall be established to suggest and maintain a detailed curriculum for the program, to be used nationwide. Actions: The committee will be formed in the next several months and will most likely be chaired by the GCA

Motion 36: Second Object- The Grand Chapter shall have a Second Object Committee to encourage, explore, support, oversee and regularly assess the fraternity-wide impact of programs related to the second object. The committee shall consist of four active professional members and a representative from the most recent collegiate chapter recipient of the best professional activities award. Actions: The committee will be formed in the next several months and will most likely be chaired by the GPA

Motion 23: Be it resolved: That the audience age limitations be removed from the Wyvern Pin requirements to ensure all chemical outreach programs are recognized. Actions: completed.

Motion 24: Be it resolved that the mandatory Scouting requirement be removed from the Wyvern Pin Program due to the non-uniform availability of opportunities to work with scouts. Actions: completed.
