# **2017 Grand Professional Alchemist Annual Report**

January 2, 2018

2017 has been a busy year for the Fraternity and for the Professional Branch. It was full of many ups and downs. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as Grand Professional Alchemist this year. I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve Alpha Chi Sigma in this manner. Even with the ups and downs this year, I was able to try out some new fundraising vehicles, send out a survey to the Professional Chapters and Groups, attend both PR Chats and Pro Chapter Chats, attend at least one ACS luncheon and organize others, help with interviewing National Office staff, perform GMA visits, attend Installations, and secure regalia from a suspended chapter. It was a very eventful year.

I have a few things I would like to touch on for 2017:

# Professional Representatives

All of the PRs are doing very well. They meet monthly via Skype, and discuss a variety of Fraternity topics. During 2017, the PRs have provided input on the annual solicitation, the alumni committee, chemical safety, Ritual Committee, marketing and social media ideas, and have shown a willingness to help the National Office (Wyvern Pin data, and general housekeeping with the changing staff). Many of them were also able to attend one or more Installations (Hannah, Stephanie, Kate). They have been ready and willing to help out, even when we've had to stop and start projects, due to other things going on. For the upcoming Biennium, Mike Raffay, Kate Cavanaugh, Hannah Bowman, and Stephanie Bates were re-elected. We sincerely thank Tim Deschaines for his service as PR chair.

### Professional Chapters and Groups

- We have acquired one new Professional Group (Atlanta Pro)! We are also hearing of possible groupings in the Tidewater Virginia area, as well as in Houston. There is also discussion of reinvigorating the Detroit Pro Group with input from recent Kettering University graduates. This may be in Detroit, or another nearby region of Michigan.
- Our Pro Expansion Chair, Kerri Federico, has been quick to answer any inquiries she has received. We were not able to do a lot of planning in this area. I am hoping to be able to rectify this in 2018.
- I sent out a survey to our current Professional Chapters and Groups. We have had 39 responses! I will present the current findings at the Winter SC meeting.
- Some of the Pro Chapters took umbrage at the way the SC handled the March for Science.

#### Solicitation

 The 2017 Solicitation mirrored the format of the previous two years (quad-fold). Due to the occurrences at the National Office during 2017, we do not have complete data yet on what was collected during the 2016 Solicitation. I am hopeful that we can use the 2017

- data (along with 2015, and what we can from 2016), to see how the new materials are being received. We mailed out approximately 25,000 letters.
- I also tried a few fundraising vehicles on Facebook. We were able to acquire approximately \$1,000 from these. I will look and see if these are new donors, or existing donors.

#### Professional Newsletter

• We had begun sending out a Professional Newsletter at the end of 2016, and early into 2017. This was halted due to the events at the National Office. Prior to that, we received praise for this new vehicle of sharing information. We also were able to acquire 10 Brothers who began using our Monthly Donation services. We are looking at reactivating the Newsletter (AGR Busch is working on this), as well as figuring out how to re-start the Monthly Donations feature as well.

# ACS-Alpha Chi Sigma Receptions

The Alpha Chi Sigma Reception at the ACS spring meeting was held at John's Grill in San Francisco, CA. The Alpha Chi Sigma Reception at the ACS summer meeting was held August 22<sup>nd</sup> at the City Tap House in Washington, DC. I was able to attend the DC meeting, and had a blast meeting with Brothers from all over the country.

#### Facebook Promotion

- We tried using a targeted promotion on Facebook, to generate traffic and expansion interest. I targeted men and women 18 65+, living in United States: Kalamazoo (+25 mi) Michigan; Springfield (+25 mi) Missouri; Las Cruces (+25 mi) New Mexico; Austin (+25 mi) Texas. It reached 2,557 people, and resulted in 49 click-thrus, and two page likes. 74% of those interested were males. This ran for 28 days, and cost \$84. I will present a further analysis at the SC meeting.
- I continued to help develop content for the Facebook postings, including interesting articles about Brothers, and their papers.

#### Installations

 I was able to attend the Installations at the University of New Orleans, Albion College, the reactivation of the University of Kentucky, and the University of Richmond. This is one of my favorite things to do as a Supreme Council member, and I am looking forward to many more.

# GMA Visits

 At GMA Wenzel's request, I performed the GMA visit for the University of Tampa Colony. They were approved for permission to petition!

#### • Risk Management Issues

- I was heavily involved with the situation at Beta Chi Chapter at Hampden-Sydney College. This involved having to go to the campus and secure their charter and regalia. It also involved a December meeting with our attorney, as well as a meeting with university officials. GMA Wenzel has made sure that I am up to date on current proceedings.
- I handled other RMP issues with professional members as needed.

It has been a wild biennium so far. I have high expectations for the start of 2018, leading up to Conclave. It has been phenomenal working with our Brothers, the office staff, my fellow members of the Supreme Council, and the Professional Representatives.
