Grand Master of Ceremonies' biennial report: This report will encompass the time from August 2016 through July 2018.

This biennium has been full of ups and downs for the Fraternity. The number of new chapters installed has been remarkable, but that excitement has been curbed by the many serious issues that arose in 2017. The scheduled review of the Ritual is now complete, and there have been eight new chapters of Alpha Chi Sigma installed since August of 2016, with one reactivation and two more that have been approved by a vote of active subordinate chapters.

Ritual Committee

The Ritual Committee put in many hours of work reviewing our Initiation Ritual and the Professional Induction Ceremony for any necessary changes and making the changes that it felt were most needed. The Ritual Committee has utilized the Slack business team messaging platform to discuss potential Ritual changes and plan committee meetings throughout 2017 and 2018. Slack is a secure electronic platform that allows for quick communication and provides the security needed to safeguard our Ritual discussions. Though there have been multiple disruptions in the National Office that resulted in a later start than originally planned, the committee has successfully completed revisions to the Initiation ritual and the Professional Induction Ceremony. In addition to the Slack discussions the Ritual Committee also met by conference call at 2-3 week intervals from July through October of 2017 to discuss the Ritual in detail and generate a list of proposed changes. After the holiday break, the Chair of the committee, Sean Pawlowski (Gamma Upsilon 2006) and I presented these to the Supreme Council for their input in January 2018. Following the Winter SC meeting, the Ritual Committee finalized the proposed changes and will present them to the Grand Chapter at the 54th Biennial Conclave in July 2018. In addition to the Chair, Sean Pawlowski, I would also like to thank PR Hannah Bowman (Beta Nu 2006) for spearheading the subcommittee working on the PIC.

Installations and Rechartering

Delta Zeta – The installation of the Delta Zeta Chapter at Christopher Newport University was held on December 3, 2016 prior to the winter Supreme Council meeting. The Delta Zeta Brothers planned a very nice lunch event, which was held in the DSU Ballroom. Several collegiate and professional Brothers were in attendance to help welcome the new chapter, and the event was live streamed via Facebook. Gary Anderson represented the Order of Altotus. Alpha Chi Sigma Scholar Committee

Science Outreach (Wyvern Pin) Program

No changes were made to the Science Outreach Program in 2017, and participation by our Brothers remains strong. However, due to the issues in the National Office many Brothers have had to wait a significant amount of time to receive their Wyvern Pins. This was unavoidable, since there were several other items of higher priority for most of the year. Now that the NO is fully staffed and operations are stabilizing, the current staff are working through Wyvern Pin applications as they arrive.

Conclusion: As I said at the beginning of this report, this biennium has seen both highs and lows. Fantastic growth and magnificent achievement by our members has been tempered by the serious issues that have plagued the National Office and other events that have overshadowed many of the plans that we had at the outset of the biennium. Two thousand seventeen was a trying year for the Supreme Council and all of Alpha Chi Sigma, but it is my opinion that we are recovering well. I have been honored to serve the Fraternity as GMC this biennium. The Supreme Council have sought to make the best decisions possible with the information that we had at the time in order to best serve the Fraternity, and we have corrected many of the practices that allowed the troubles of 2017 to occur. I believe that these changes will make Alpha Chi Sigma more resilient in the long run and will make the Fraternity better able to respond to any future challenges..
