FUNDAMENTALS OF PARLIAMENTARY LAW

- 1. Justice and courtesy for all.
- 2. Do only one thing at a time.
- 3. The majority rules.
- 4. The rights of the minority must be protected.
- 5. Each proposition is entitled to full and free debate.
- The purpose is to facilitate action, not to obstruct it. 6.
- The desires of an individual must be merged into the 7. desires of the assembly.
